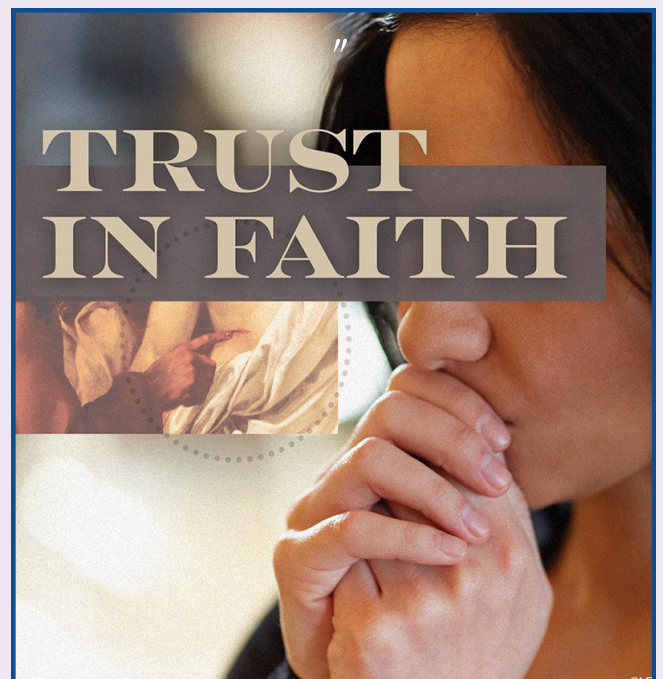
PRAYER BEFORE HOLY COMMUNION

The Gift of Divine Mercy

As we gather on this Second Sunday of Easter, commonly known as Divine Mercy Sunday, we are reminded of the depth and breadth of God's mercy toward us, a truth that resonates throughout the Scriptures we reflect upon today. In Acts 2, we see the early Christians living in unity, breaking bread together and sharing their resources. Their joy was infectious: "And day by day, the Lord added to their number those who were being saved." This communal spirit of faith exemplifies the mercy extended not only from God but among one another, a profound reminder that mercy flourishes in relationship.

Psalms 118 sings of the steadfast love of the Lord, proclaiming, "His mercy endures forever." In the face of challenges and uncertainties, it is this unwavering mercy that sustains us. As we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, we are called to both receive and impart this mercy in our own lives. In the Gospel of John 20, Jesus tells Thomas, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." This statement encapsulates the essence of our

There's a beautiful anecdote from St. Faustina Kowalska, the apostle of Divine Mercy, who once shared how she feared the depths of her sins, yet God unveiled the joy in His mercy. She wrote, "The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to My mercy." This profound truth reminds us that our sins do not disqualify us from receiving mercy; rather, it is precisely in our brokenness that God's mercy shines brightest.

As we step into this week ahead, let us embody the spirit of Divine Mercy. May we seek opportunities to be merciful to others, just as we have received mercy so abundantly from God. Remember, every act of kindness, forgiveness, and compassion has the power to transform our communities and bear witness to the love of Christ. In a world that often feels fractured, let us become beacons of hope, reflecting the mercy of God in a tangible way. Happy Divine Mercy Sunday!

A DEEPER EXPERIENCE: **Embracing Divine Mercy**

RECOMMENDED REFLECTION. This self-reflective exercise is designed to prepare your heart and mind for a deeper experience during the Eucharistic Holy Hour, fostering a spirit of gratitude and a readiness to share God's mercy with others.

1. Find a Comfortable Space (2 minutes)

-Sit comfortably in a quiet place. Close your eyes and take a few deep breaths to center yourself.

2. Invoking the Presence of God (2 minutes)

-Begin by inviting the Holy Spirit to guide your reflection. Say a simple prayer: "Come, Holy Spirit, fill my heart and guide my thoughts."

3. Reflect on God's Mercy (5 minutes)

- Consider the following questions:

*How have I experienced God's mercy in my life?

*Are there times I have struggled to extend mercy to others?

-Reflect on specific moments of grace, forgiveness, or love you've received.

4. Wish to Extend Mercy (5 minutes)

-Think of someone in your life who may need your forgiveness or compassion.

-Ask yourself:

*What steps can I take to offer them mercy?

*How might I be called to embody God's mercy towards them?

5. Prayer for Transformation (5 minutes)

- Pray for the strength to be an instrument of mercy: "Lord, help me to reflect Your love and mercy in my actions and words. Teach me to forgive as You forgive."

- Spend the last moments in silence, opening your heart to God's transformative grace.

6. Conclude with Gratitude (3 minutes)

- End your meditation by expressing gratitude for God's mercy.

*You can say: "Thank you, Lord, for Your endless compassion and love. Help me to live in accordance with this gift."

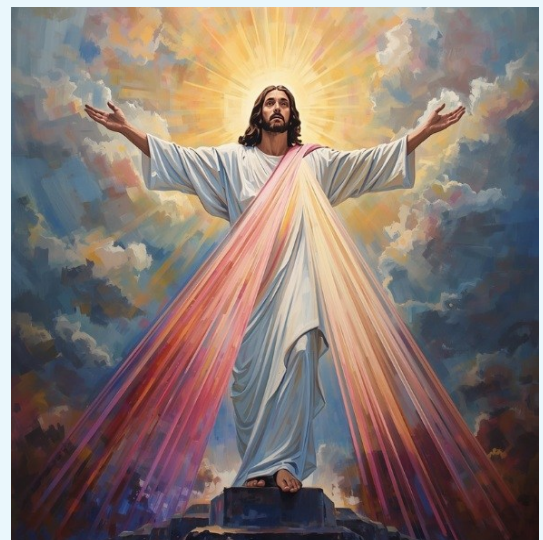
