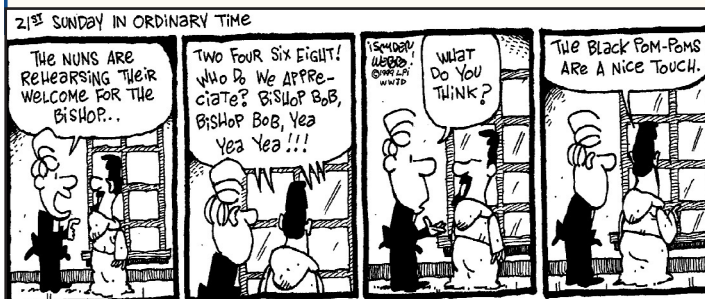

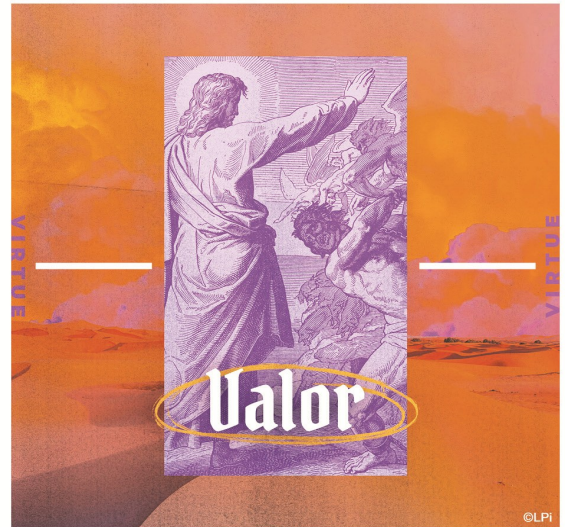

The Keys To The Trust

There's an old story about a small-town locksmith who, near the end of his life, handed his shop keys to his apprentice—not the keys to the register or the safe, but the master keys that opened every door in town he'd ever served. "These aren't just keys," he said. "They're the trust of every family who let me into their home when they were locked out, scared, or starting over." The apprentice understood: he wasn't just inheriting metal and teeth cut into steel. He was inheriting responsibility.

That's the weight behind today's readings. In Isaiah, the Lord tells Eliakim, "I will place the key of the House of David on his shoulder; when he opens, no one shall shut, when he shuts, no one shall open." A key, in Scripture, is never merely a tool—it's an office, a stewardship, a share in authority that isn't self-generated but given.

That's precisely what happens in the Gospel. Peter doesn't earn the keys to the Kingdom by cleverness. He answers Jesus' question—"Who do you say that I am?"—with a confession that comes, Jesus tells him, not from flesh and blood but from the Father. And then comes the astonishing gift: "I will give you the keys of the Kingdom of heaven." Peter, impulsive and imperfect, becomes the

one entrusted with binding and loosing.

Psalm 138 gives us the right posture toward all this: gratitude and wonder—"I will give thanks to you, O Lord, with all my heart." And Paul, in Romans, reminds us why that wonder is fitting: "How inscrutable his ways! For who has known the mind of the Lord?" We are not the source of the grace we carry. We are stewards of it.

Like that locksmith's apprentice, every one of us has been handed something not entirely our own—a parish role, a family's trust, a friend's confidence, a piece of the Church's mission. The question isn't whether we deserve the keys. None of us fully do. The question is whether, like Peter, we'll let our stumbling confession of faith be the doorway through which Christ works anyway.



St. Joseph Calasanz, Priest

St. Joseph Calasanz was born in 1557 in Aragon, Spain, into a noble family that expected him to pursue prestige within the Church. He earned doctorates in law and theology, and by every worldly measure, a comfortable ecclesiastical career awaited him. But a visit to plague- and poverty-stricken Rome changed the direction of his life. There, he encountered children roaming the streets—uneducated, unsupervised, and locked out of any future beyond poverty—because schooling in that era was reserved for those who could pay.

Joseph saw in these children something his contemporaries often overlooked: not a burden, but a door waiting to be opened. In 1597, he founded what became the first free public school in Europe, and later established the Piarists—the Order of the Pious Schools—dedicated entirely to educating poor children. He insisted that education, not just charity, was the way out of the cycle of poverty. He taught reading, writing, and mathematics alongside the faith, convinced that forming the mind was inseparable from forming the soul. His reward for this vision was not comfort but conflict.

Jealous rivals within the Church slandered him, and in his eighties, Joseph was stripped of leadership over the very order he founded, watching from the sidelines as his life's work seemed to unravel. Yet he never abandoned the children or grew bitter toward those who wronged him. He trusted that the mission was God's, not his own possession to defend at all costs.

Joseph Calasanz understood what Peter learned at Caesarea Philippi: the keys we're given aren't ours to hoard or control—they're entrusted for the sake of others, especially those the world has locked out. He opened a door that Church and society had shut, and no opposition, however painful, was able to shut it again.

For reflection: Who in your life has been "locked out"—of opportunity, dignity, or belonging—by circumstances beyond their control? What door has God entrusted to you, even in a small way, to hold open for them?
